PART- A

The Plan of Action towards Quality Enhancement

The IQAC, T. H. B. College chalked out the following programmes in the beginning of the year 2008 towards quality enhancement.

A. Plan of action during 2007-2008

The following initiatives were taken to fulfill the proposed plan during 2007-08:

- i. Organization of two UGC sponsored National Seminars by the Department of Zoology and the Department of Economics.
- ii. Almost all the Departments of the college organized Departmental Seminars to encourage the students in different areas of the concerned subject.
- iii. One Lecturer from the Department of English attended the Refresher Course at NEHU, Shillong on Functional English.
- iv. A State level workshop was organized by the college in collaboration with Assam Sahitya Shabha, Jamuguri Branch on the theme of “Modern Poetry in Assamese literature”.
- v. Construction of boundary wall around the college campus in a phase-wise manner.
- vi. Construction of a well furnished boys’ hostel.
- vii. Extension of existing tea garden for generating funds for the college.

viii. Development of in-campus link roads.

B. Infrastructure development

- i. Two 3 x 8 sq. mt. cycle and bike stands were constructed.
- ii. For solving the problems faced by the students in transportation initiative was taken but yet the problem remains unsolved. This long standing problem requires new kind of approach.
- iii. The process of construction of boundary walls was delayed due to the process of conversion of NH 52 (adjacent to the college campus) to a four lane Highway, as it was apprehended that it might lead to demolition of the walls adjacent to the highway.
- iv. Old college building was renovated and converted to for boys' hostel for SC/ST students hailing from remote areas and the foot-hills of Arunachal Pradesh (border of Assam).
- v. Link-roads of sand gravel and bricks were constructed. Additional fund for link road construction was provided by the Gaon Panchayat and Mahakuma Parisad.

C. Academic development

- i. Internal assessment of 10 marks in each paper for every student of TDC 1st year, TDC 2nd year and TDC 3rd years was done as per direction of the Gauhati University. Two Unit-test exams, each of 12 marks, were conducted by each department of the college. Attendance of each student was well maintained for the same.

- ii. Tutorial and remedial classes were conducted in the department of English as well as in all science subject by the respective faculties.
- iii. Multi-gymnasium was well administered with the help of a local NGO for the development of physical health of the students of the as well as the youth of the locality.

PART B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The following activities have been taken by the college authority to achieve the goals and objectives of the institution:

- i. In-campus link roads to different departments, library and office were constructed.
- ii. Two teachers were selected for UGC's FIP (FDP) to pursue PhD in Tezpur University and Rajib Gandhi University, respectively.
- iii. Special attempts were made to recognize the students with low IQ and consequent measures viz. remedial courses, bridge courses were taken to facilitate their learning.
- iv. Measures were taken for upliftment of the infrastructural facilities up to the mark.
- v. Teachers' participation in research, consultancy and extension is encouraged.
- vi. Examination results show remarkable improvement in the students' academic performance in the recent years.
- vii. Initiatives were taken for development of self-confidence in the students to harness different available career options through Career Counseling and Guidance Cell.
- viii. Initiatives were taken for upgradation of the poor quality students in academic activities.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG & PG):

- i. Carrier Orientation Programme (COP) is being continued for this year.

The following courses are provided under this programme:

- a. Food Processing and Preservation

- b. Industrial Fish and Fisheries
 - c. Sericulture
- ii. Various carrier-oriented computer courses have been provided under the Computer Education Centre of the college.
- iii. The existing Academic programmes are:
- a. UG course in Science, Humanities and Social Sciences.
 - b. PG course in Political Science, History, Economics, Assamese, English, Mathematics & Commerce under Institute of Distance and Open Learning (IDOL) Contact Centre, Gauhati University.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

The syllabi of the UG (Major and General) courses are provided by the University of Gauhati. However, the syllabi of the COP are based on the needs of the students and local conditions of the area and the courses are prepared by the concerned course coordinators and are approved by the Gauhati University.

4. Initiation in inter-disciplinary programmes:

The COP and various computer courses offered by the computer education centre of the college are being undergone by the students from both Arts and Science streams.

5. Examination reforms initiated:

Steps are being undertaken to introduce Semester System at UG level and are supposed to come into effect from the session 2011-12.

6. Candidates qualified for NET/SLET/GATE etc.: Dose not arise.

7. Initiatives towards faculty development programmes:

Mrs. Ajanta Nath, HoD, Department of Statistics has been pursuing Ph.D. under Faculty Improvement Programme (FIP) since 2008. She is registered at the Tezpur University for Ph.D.

By analyzing feedback forms, it has been found that the average rank of the teachers of the college ranges from 6.73 to 9.27 in different departments. It also reveals that the average ranking on the attribute no.-3 (Ability to integrate course material with environment) and attribute no.- 7 (Provision of sufficient timely feedback) is relatively high. Students' response on teachers'

communication skill, interest generation, sincerity and commitment is found to be quite encouraging.

Action taken on students' feedback

Different steps were taken by the college authority for improvement of teachers' efficiency. The teachers were encouraged by the college authority to participate in refresher courses, orientation courses, workshops, seminars etc. Award to the best department was also given on the basis of performance of students in the degree final year examinations to encourage the teachers.

Format no-3: Student's Course and Teaching Evaluation

After analyzing the feedback forms (Format no-3) on students' course-teaching evaluation, the following facts have been obtained:

- i. 79% of the students reported that their syllabus was adequate when it was challenging for 21%
- ii. 35% of the students reported that their syllabus was easy but 65% of them reported it as inadequate.
- iii. 30% of the students reported that the course was conceptually easy and 50% students reported that it was manageable and the rest 15% of them reported it as difficult and 5% reported it as very difficult.
- iv. On the query regarding syllabus taught in the class, the students responded in the following manner, 90 to 100 % = 45%, 75 to 90% = 30% and 50 to 75% = 25% respectively.
- v. Student's opinion on the library holding for the course: Excellent 30%, Adequate 50% and Inadequate 20%
- vi. Opinion of the students regarding access to the library: the prescribed/ recommended readings: Excellent 80%, Adequate 20%
- vii. Teachers prepared for class: Thoroughly 28%, With difficulty 65%, Not at all 7%
- viii. Teachers able to communicate: Efficiently 70%, Badly 30%
- ix. Teachers who encouraged students' participation in class: Yes 80%, No 20%
- x. Teacher encouraged students using following methods: Encouraged question 15%, Discussion in Class 68%, discussed outside the class 17%

- xi. Helpful from teachers' advice 70%, Unhelpful 15% & on time helpful 15%.
- xii. Internal assessment was fair 80%, not fair 20%
- xiii. The effect of internal assessment on course grade: improved 72%, lower it 16.6% & not affected 11.2%
- xiv. Teacher obtained feedback performance: Regularly 60%, Irregularly 28%, In time 12%
- xv. Approach of the teachers: Courteous 83%, Indifferent 17%
- xvi. Assignments discussed with students: Yes Fully 55%, Yes Partly 35%, No 10%
- xvii. Teachers who provide a course in the beginning of the year: Yes 70%, No 30%
- xviii. Lecture was helpful for the students: Yes 60%, No 40%

25. Computerization of administration and the process of administration and examination (results, issue of certificate):

- i. About 80% of the official works are done with the help of computer. Proposals have been submitted to UGC for complete up-gradation of the office.
- ii. The Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC) and the Gauhati University (GU) provide the original certificates after completion of the course to the students. The college authority issues the provisional certificates to the students after completion of course. 35. Activities of the Guidance & Counseling Cell:

Although the college has no direct placement cell, Carrier Counseling and Guidance Cell (CC & GC) of the college provided proper guidance and counseling to the students when needed.

36. Placement services provided to students:

The ex-students of this college have been employed in different Central & State Govt. departments and private enterprises. The NCC students were employed in Army, CRPF, and APBN etc. Some of them are employed in banking sector, some in medical, some in electricity department, some in

education dept., some in the Indian railways, some in private companies' viz. Nokia, Air Cell, etc. Many of the students are employed in different company services in mega cities of the country.

37. Development programmes for non-teaching staff:

- i. Under the programme of phase-wise training on Computer applications, five non-teaching staff members already got the training.
- ii. Salary of the staff recruited in non-sanctioned posts was increased.
- iii. Some of the staff members attended a workshop organized by the Academic Staff College of Gauhati University.

38. Healthy practices of the institution:

The college has organized awareness programme against insurgency among the students. Awareness programmes on drinking water, malaria and drug abuse were organized with the help of the local people of the Karchantola area. The Department of Geography organized a departmental Seminar on Men-environment relationship. The students of the TDC II yr. conducted a field trip to Nameri National Park and Pakke Tiger Reserve. The Department of Zoology organized Departmental Seminar's for three days each with 45 minutes duration where the students presented their papers before the Principal and the teachers of the Department.

40. Others:

The employment of the graduates from the college is one of the major problems of the college as it is situated in rural area and as maximum students hail from the remotest areas. Again, most of the students of the college belong to SC, ST and Tea Garden Communities. Proper counseling and guidance is necessary for these students so that they can be absorbed in various fields to harness their knowledge and skill in service of the society. Efforts have been made to improve the employment situation in the area.

The number of drop-outs students is found to be considerably high. In order to reduce the number of drop-outs several measures have been adopted by the college authority. Since a majority of students comes from economically backward families, therefore the college authority has introduced various career oriented programmes (COPs) to make them self-reliant in future.
